You are warmly invited to join once again with every parish in the diocese in a Novena to the Holy **Spirit** – our dedicated period of prayer, reflection and planning for the renewal of the Church in the Arch diocese of Dublin. The Novena will take place in the nine days from 12th – 20th May beginning on the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, through Pentecost and continuing to the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. As well as being a time of prayer, this Novena time can be used to plan, in parish and partnership of parishes, for the pastoral year ahead guided by the Spirit.

The Church-24 survey has three main objectives: 1. To listen to churchgoers on a range of long-standing issues and questions, particularly as they are being brought to light in the synodal process. 2. To explore some new issues that face us now, or soon will, but which were not talked about so much a decade ago, such as climate change, artificial intelligence, assisted dying or safeguarding procedures. 3.
